Meanwhile, our West Island location is now the First Christian Reformed Church, in Dollard-des-Ormeaux, minutes away from a park and bus routes. Youth Leadership Program

Once again this summer, we included a unique Shadows-in-Training program component, where teenagers between 14 and 17 learn to assist our shadows in accompanying children who have special needs.

The CC Youth Leadership Program is a great opportunity for teenagers to learn valuable skills through our training and weekly workshops dedicated to their interests in social justice and childhood development.

Athletics & Well-being

This summer we further expanded our Athletics Program to include not only traditional sports-based programming but also initiatives with the overall well-being of our campers in mind. Our Athletics Coordinator planned various sporting activities alongside cooking and baking workshops in order to educate our campers about what kinds of fuel makes their bodies move in the games they love so much. During staff training, our counselors learned how to provide inclusive and accessible programming so that all of our campers were able to participate in moving their bodies and eating yummy nutritious food. Access to fresh garden vegetables and wide open green space at both our locations allowed us to run a successful and well-rounded Athletics and Well-being program that included activities such as dance workshops, volleyball and soccer tournaments.



Environmental Education

Summer 2019 saw the continued expansion of our Environmental Program. Our new locations have allowed us to have compost and recycling services on site for an even more convenient educational approach to management for our campers. Campers reused and re-purposed materials for fun activities such as personalized plant pots and boat building contests. Hiking trips and visits to community gardens allowed our campers to really experience nature. The access to practically unlimited green space at our new camp locations has allowed us to increase the amount of time among trees, grass and wildlife more than ever before!

Intercultural Exchange

This year's Intercultural Program at Camp Cosmos continued to bring together the various cultures and communities that make up our camp community. Emphasis was placed on sharing aspects of campers' and their families' cultures, educating our campers about Indigenous issues and acknowledging the issues that immigrants to Canada may face in a comprehensible fashion. Our new Intercultural Coordinator took pride in creating fun and age-appropriate ways of presenting such topics and balancing them with fun activities such as body mapping, therapy dogs and cooking activities that enabled the children to understand the beautiful similarities and differences that exist between us all!







Accessibility

In 2019, we were able to hire 9 shadows to accompany our campers with special needs.

We were grateful for our fantastic team, lead by our Accessibility Directors, who provided support and resources for our campers who have disabilities. Four days of training helped them to adapt the daily camp activities to ensure that all our campers were included and able to participate.

At Camp Cosmos, we are proud to create a welcoming environment where each camper receives the support they need to shine.

Montreal

Our trips to Verdun Beach and Sentier Urbains, as well as our activity with therapy dogs, were huge successes. The staff and campers loved the new space, with its great kitchen, where we hosted cooking activities with our campers, and being located right next to beautiful Westmount Park was a joy!

West Island

Successes at our Dollard-des-Ormeaux camp included outings to Ubisoft World where kids played in ballpits and slides, and experimented with Virtual Reality. The Cap Saint Jacques natural reserve was also a great trip and our campers had the pleasure to collect butterflies, ants and other insects at the nature alley with a workshop hosted by GUEPE.
